## SYLLABUS: SAMSKRITA CONVERSATION COURSE

Sanskrit is one of the oldest languages not only of India but of the world. It is a treasure house and living proof of the culture, philosophy, arts and sciences of Indian civilization spanning thousands of years.

The course is intended for the students with little or no prior knowledge of this language. The course has been designed in a way that can be a stepping stone for those who want to get acquainted with the rich tradition, culture and philosophy of India. Those who are already engaged in the study of Sanskrit this course will also be helpful in furthering their studies.

At the end of the course, participants will become well acquainted with Sanskrit phonetics, syntax, verbal and nominal declension, conjugation. Through rigorous exercises, the participants will be able to express themselves through Sanskrit. The participants will be able to understand and analyze simple Sanskrit sentences.

## A Manner of Lecturing

Explanatory, Power-point presentation (for concepts, exercises) Practice and Exercises will be conducted through interactive / question & answer method.

Week-7: Practice of everyday usable verbs in present tense: eat (खाद), drink (पिब्), sleep (शीङ्), know (ज्ञा), do (কৃ), buy (क्री), can (शक्), listen (श्रु), take (गृह्), give (दा) etc.

Week-8: Use and practice of causative verbs (णिजन्त): 'to make someone do something' (कारयति), to "make someone read' (पाउयति) etc.

Week-9:	Use and Practice of some other Indeclinable regarding direction: in front of (पुरतः), behind (पृष्ठतः), to the left (वामतः), to the right (दक्षिणतः), over (उपरि), down/under (अधः) etc.
Week-10:	Use and practice of imperative (लोट्)verbs
Week-11	Use and practice of past tense (লভ্) verbs
Week-12	Use and practice of past tense (লঙ্) verbs
Week-13	'Past active participle': Use and practice
Week-14	Use and Practice of some other Indeclinable: today (अद्या), tomorrow (শ্ব:), yesterday (ह्य:), now (णिजन्त), just (णिजन्त), so (णिजन्त), in that manner (णिजन्त), once (णिजन्त), sometimes (णिजन्त), Never (णिजन्त)
