Profile of Speaker INAUGURAL SESSION

Shri Ram Madhav

Dr. Ram Madhav is an Indian politician, author and thinker. Besides discharging his responsibilities as a political leader, Dr Madhav is a Founding Member of the Governing Council of India Foundation (IF). In over a decade of India Foundation's existence, Dr Madhav has been the curator of major global and national multilateral initiatives like Indian Ocean Conference and Counterterrorism Conference involving heads of nations and leaders of governments besides academics, scholars and public spirited individuals.

A renowned author and thinker, Dr Madhav has over 200 publications to his credit and a Doctorate in Philosophy from Nalanda University. He has authored several books in English and Telugu. Some of his most recent works include "Partitioned Freedom"; "The Hindutva Paradigm — Integral Humanism and the Quest for a Non-Western Worldview"; "Because India Comes First: Reflections on Nationalism, Identity and Culture" and "Uneasy Neighbours: India and China after 50 years of the war". He is a regular contributor to platforms like The Indian Express, The Hindustan Times and OPEN Magazine amongst others. He had been the editor of Bharatiya Pragna, a monthly magazine in English published by Pragna Bharati, and associate editor of Jagriti, a Telugu weekly.

Widely regarded for his contributions in the field of strategic thinking, political philosophy and India's foreign policy, Dr Madhav has travelled widely and addressed forums like the Shangri-La Dialogue in Singapore, Raisina Dialogue in India, Halifax Security Forum in Canada, Sochi Eurasian Integration Forum in Russia, BRICS Political Forum in China, and the World Peace Conference in Thailand.

Profile of Speakers SESSION-2

Dr. Srikanth Kondapalli

Dr. Srikanth Kondapalli is Dean and Professor in Chinese Studies at School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University. He is also an Honorary Fellow at Institute of Chinese Studies, Delhi and Research Associate at Centre for Chinese Studies, University of Stellenbosch, South Africa. He served at Institute for Defence Studies & Analyses, New Delhi for nearly 12 years. He is educated in Chinese studies in India and China with a specialisation in Modern Chinese History in Master of Arts at Osmania University at Hyderabad, Master of Philosophy and Doctor of Philosophy in 1989 and 1995 respectively in Chinese Studies Division of School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. He learnt Chinese language at Beijing Language & Culture University and was a post-Doctoral Visiting Fellow at People's University, Beijing from 1996-98. He was a Visiting Professor at National Chengchi University, Taipei in 2004. He has published books, monographs and articles in national and international journals and newspapers. He has also presented several research papers at national and international conferences in India and abroad and lectured at Indian academic, defence, and media establishments. He is a guest faculty member at College of Naval Warfare, Army War College, Indo-Tibetan Border Police Academy and Border Security Force Academy.

Mr. Surinder Bhagat

Mr. Surinder Bhagat is a career diplomat who joined the Indian Foreign Service in 2007, after obtaining his Bachelor Degree in Engineering (hons) from BITS Pilani in Rajasthan. Mr. Bhagat has held various positions in New Delhi and abroad. During his overseas assignment, he had served as Counsellor (Political and Commerce) in Embassy of India, Doha. He has also served as First Secretary in the Embassy of India, Riyadh, Saudi Arabia and as Third Secretary in the Embassy of India, Cairo, Egypt. At headquarters, he had served as Deputy Secretary in the Pakistan, Afghanistan and Iran (PAI) Division and as Under Secretary in the West Asia and North Africa (WANA) Division in the Ministry of External Affairs. Mr. Bhagat speaks Dogri, Hindi, Punjabi and English and has also functional knowledge of Arabic and Urdu. He is interested in issues relating to foreign policy. His other interests include golf, reading, hiking and swimming.

Dr. Sonu Trivedi

Dr. Sonu Trivedi is Director, Swami Vivekananda Cultural Centre, Embassy of India, Seoul. She joined as Assistant Professor, Zakir Husain Delhi College, University of Delhi in 2006. Before moving to the diplomatic assignment at Seoul, she was a Fellow at Nehru Memorial Museum and Library, New Delhi. She was also a Visiting Fellow at Institute of Asia Pacific Studies, CASS, Beijing (2011), member of Myanmar Core Group at ICWA (2014) and a Visiting faculty at IIM, Indore (2015-16). She was also the Convenor, Southeast Asia Research Group at Department of Political Science, University of Delhi and Founder Director, Centre for Vietnam Studies, New Delhi. She has published books and research papers and contributed several articles in newspapers & magazines.

Prof. K G Suresh is a Senior Journalist, Columnist, Educationist, Socio Political Commentator & Communication Strategist. He is currently serving as Vice Chancellor, Makhanlal Chaturvedi National University of Journalism & Communication, Bhopal, Asia's first and India's oldest and largest media university. Earlier, he has served as Director General, Indian Institute of Mass Communication - India's premier media training institution; Senior Consulting Editor with Doordarshan News, India's public news broadcaster; Founder Dean, School of Modern Media, University of Petroleum & Energy Studies, Dehradun; Editorial Consultant with Asianet News Network; Chief Political Correspondent with Press Trust of India and Group Media Advisor to Dalmia Bharat Enterprises Ltd. He is a recipient of the prestigious Ganesh Shankar Vidyarthi Award for outstanding contribution to Journalism by the Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Ministry of Education, Government of India. He was earlier designated Commonwealth Youth Ambassador for Peace by Commonwealth Youth Programme, Asia. He is also the Founder President of the Global Media Education Council, the only India driven international academic platform and has been a member of various national and international bodies. A TEDx Speaker & Henry Stewart Talks faculty, Prof Suresh had successfully completed an Experiential Course in Public Health Communication from the University of Oxford, United Kingdom. A media educator since his early days, Prof Suresh has served as Visiting Professor at various institutions in India and abroad and has extensively travelled across India and the world.

He also has oversight responsibilities with Ulsan Aluminum, a joint venture between Novelis Korea and Kobe Steel, Prior to being named to this position, Mr. Satpute has served as Chief Marketing Officer, Hindalco Industries Limited. Before that, he held roles of increasing responsibility within Novelis, including Director of Business Development & Strategy for Novelis Asia; Vice President of Sales, Marketing & Technical Services for Novelis Asia; and Managing Director of Aluminium Company of Malaysia Berhad (ALCOM). Mr. Satpute has nearly 30 years of experience in the aluminium industry, having started his career at INDAL, which was a subsidiary of ALCAN, Canada. He has a rich educational experience which includes a degree in mechanical engineering from Pune University and MBA in Marketing from Mumbai University.
